




Rule 1:

Verbs and subjects have to agree in numbers.

singular verbs need singular subjects and vice versus.





Rule 3: When 2 or more singular nouns are linked by or or nor the verb is singular.

Rule 4: If there are 2 subjects and 1 is singular and the other plural than the verb must agree with the one it is closes to.

What was rule number 3? Can you give an example?

Answer: When 2 or more singular nouns are linked by *or* or *nor* the verb is singular. Ex: The dogs or the cats run in the field.



She (goes,go) to the shoe store and (meets, meet) with her friends.

Answer: goes, meets
